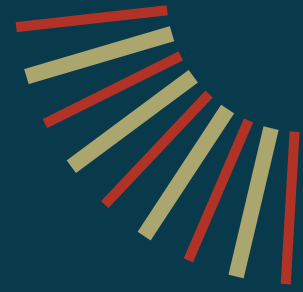

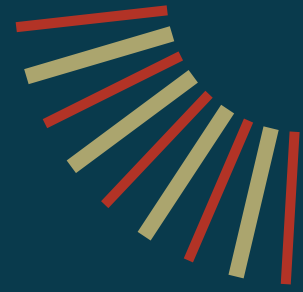


**LOCATION MAP**

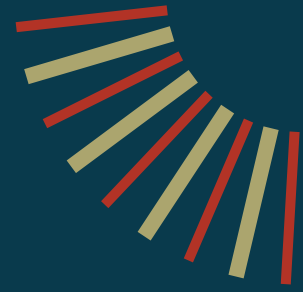
